Types of Grants

Local Grants

- Port Authorities
- Chamber of Commerce i.e. Caviar grant
- Local Nonprofits

State and Federal Grants

- Montana Arts Council
- MT Department of Commerce – Comm.

Types of Grants cont.

STATE OR FEDERAL GRANTS

- Usually very strict in their goals and objectives of grant program
- Usually have strict guidelines, formatting requirements, etc. for grant submittal
- Usually formal, and often performance-based reporting
- Local grant applications may be shorter in length

PRIVATE FOUNDATION GRANTS

- Usually advance a particular cause
- May be geographically-based
- May limit characters or words; often shorter than federal grants
- Reporting can vary based on foundation
- May be less formal in evaluation
- May ask for a Letter of Intent before grant is applied for

Grantwriting Process/Procedures

- •Research and understand your school district's requirements
 - Approvals needed?
 - Administrator signature required?
 - Approval based on grant amount?

Grantwriting Process/Procedures

- Preparation is KEY
 - Start with your project idea then build goals and objectives to achieve it
 - Understand level of project (lesson plan based, infrastructure-based, etc.), will inform your grant search
 - Research grants available locally and nationally
 - Develop your own regional grants database
 - Strategize and plan your approach to grants

Grantwriting Process/Procedures

- Plan for Grant Implementation
 - Identify individuals who will implement grant
 - Identify individuals who will manage grant
 - Who will file final report?

Grantwriting Process/Procedures

- Adhere to grant application sections
- •Example sections typically found in grant applications are:
 - Introduction to the Organization
 - Project Description
 - Need
 - Project Plan and Activities
 - Budget
 - Evaluation
 - Supporting Documents
 - Abstract (often written last)

- •Introduction to the Organization
 - Concise sentences introducing grant reviewer to your school

- Project Description
- Project Need
- •Aka Project Narrative


