GRANT OPPORTUNITY – Montana Department of Environmental Quality

The Montana Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) is celebrating National Drive Electric Week with new funding opportunities to help curb nitrogen oxide (NOx) emissions with clean transportation. The grants are available for public and private entities and match funds to help make clean transportation affordable.



The first funding opportunity, the <u>Clean Truck</u>, <u>Bus & Airport Equipment Program</u>, matches funds to replace older diesel trucks, buses or airport ground support vehicles with battery electric, alternate fuel or diesel vehicles. Examples of types of vehicles for this funding opportunity can include garbage trucks, street sweepers, bucket trucks, buses, or vehicles that service aircrafts between flights.

Applications for this opportunity are due January 14, 2022.

The second funding opportunity is the <u>Clean School Bus Program</u> that applies to school districts statewide and matches funds to replace older diesel school buses with newer diesel, gasoline, propane, low NOx certified or battery electric buses. This opportunity has funded 23 diesel buses and 8 propane buses at school



districts across the state since January of 2020. Applications for this opportunity are due November 15, 2021 with project completion by August of 2022.

Another GRANT OPPORTUNITY – OPI School Nutrition Program

The School Food Service Equipment Grant is available for Montana school districts that operate the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) or the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) during SY2021-22 to obtain new equipment or to renovate or replace existing equipment. The OPI has \$68,638 available to award via competitive sub-grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$5,000 to Montana school districts.

Application deadline is November 5, 2021 - School Nutrition Equipment Grant

Breast Cancer Awareness

Breast cancer is the second most common kind of cancer in women. About 1 in 8 women born today in the United States will get breast cancer at some point in their lives.

Things to know about getting a Mammogram

1 WHAT IS A MAMMOGRAM?

A mammogram is an x-ray of the breast that's used to find breast changes. X-rays were first used to examine breast tissues nearly a century ago.

2 WHERE TO GET ONE

The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) certifies mammogram facilities that meet high professional standards of quality and safety.

2 WHEN TO SCHEDULE ONE

The best time to schedule a mammogram is about a week after your menstrual period.

4. WHAT NOT TO WEAR

A two piece outfit is best for ease and comfort. You'll need to remove your top and bra. Do not apply deodorant, lotion, powder, ointment, etc around your chest on the day of your appointment. These products can appear on the x-ray.

S WHAT TO EXPECT

The entire procedure takes about 20 minutes. The breast is compressed between two plastic plates for a few seconds while an x-ray is taken. It's repositioned and compressed again to take another angle. This is repeated on the other breast.

GETTING THE RESULTS

You should know your results within 10 days. If you don't hear back, call your doctor. If something suspicious is found, you'll likely be contacted to get other tests. This doesn't mean you have cancer. A suspicious finding may bet dense breast tissues or a cist. Other times the image may just not be clear enough and needs to be retaken. If it is your first mammogram, your doctor may want to look at a particular area more closely because there is no previous mammogram for comparison.
